Cinque Terre NATIONAL PARK

Cinque Terre National Park, the most renowned national park in Italy, is a protected territory located in the province of La Spezia, Liguria in northern Italy. It is the smallest national park in Italy with 4,300 acres, however it is the densest with 5,000 permanent inhabitants living amongst the five towns. The territory encompasses the towns of Riomaggiore, Manarola, Corniglia, Vernazza and Monterosso al Mare, as well as parts of the communes of Levanto and La Spezia. Cinque Terre was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1997.

The Five Villages

Riomaggiore

Riomaggiore is the first stop on many Cinque Terre visits. Peeling pastel buildings line down a steep ravine to a tiny harbour is one of Cinque Terre's most romantic sights. A botanical garden and bird watching centre are also worth visiting in Riomaggiore

Manarola

The grapevines that surround Manarola produce the Cinque Terre wine, Sciacchetrà. Punta Bonfiglio, which a short uphill hike from the town, has fabulous views on the Ligurian sea.

Corniglia

Sitting atop a 100m-high rocky promontory surrounded by vineyards, Corniglia is the only village that lacks direct access to the sea. Its tranquil, tangled streets lead to a broad and breezy sea-facing terrace, where you can see all five villages at once.

Vernazza

Vernazza's small harbour and it's Piazza Marconi with its sea-facing amphitheatre of pastel houses are some of Cinque Terre's most iconic sights.




Activities TO DO

Along the coastline, visitors can find a beach at Monterosso, which is the only village that has a strip of beach.



VISIT FOOD AND WINE PRODUCERS

Sciacchetrà wine and Cinque Terre DOC wines are produced in Cinque Terre vineyards built on steep cliffs

- l'Olio del Busanco di Ferri Giampietro in Riomaggiore


Hiking Trails

This 12km path offers some of Cinque Terre's most spectacular coastal scenery. The hike starts in Manarola and has a low level of difficulty. The Monterosso to Vernazza section is 3km and takes up to two hours and the high path from Vernazza to Cornigila is 4km and takes about 90 minutes.

The famed Via dell'Amore is a pedestrian street along the coast overlooking the sea linking the villages of Riomagiorre and Manarola. The total length is 1 km and takes about 30 minutes, the route one of the most important tourist attractions in the area and is an integral part of the Cinque Terre National Park.

Experienced walkers will find it hard to resist the lure of this legendary trail, also known as the Red or High Trail. Allow between nine and 12 hours to complete the 35 km route, which runs from Porto Venere to Levanto, forming an arc high above the Cinque Terre villages. It's mainly flat and tree-covered, with plenty of bars and restaurants along the way.

Each of the Cinque Terre's villages has their own sanctuary perched high on the cliff-sides overlooking the sea. The walks winds through through terraced vineyards with spectacular views. Most of these walks are easy and take between 20 minutes and three hours one way.
